We recently had a very wet weekend. All morning, the rain had been lashing down and the forecast for the rest of the day was heavy rain and lightning, so we had given up hope of getting out for a walk. We were very glad that we had taken the opportunity when it came. On this particular occasion, we went to the National Trust woodland at Alderley Edge. It seemed incredible that such a dead-looking tree could have continued to produce new life. Somehow the tree had managed to retain some intact roots and, with some support, it had overcome its hopeless situation and had been enabled to carry on growing. It reminded us of the enduring power of nature and of God's love.

There are many examples of perseverance in the natural world, from plants such as cacti which can survive with hardly any water, to plants such as gorse which can regrow after being completely burned to the ground. There are also those plants which persevere, even when we wish they wouldn't, like the weeds which keep springing up around the patio, no matter how many times we try to dig them up!

It isn't always easy to keep going or to keep trusting God, especially when we might feel worn out or disheartened. The Bible reminds us, "Those who trust in the Lord for help, will find their strength renewed" (Isaiah 40: 31). When we take the time to look, there is inspiration all around us.
